### Importation into Panama



It is important that you **confirm exactly what type of food or drink would be imported** in order to validate with the corresponding entities if there is any special requirement.

#### Procedure requires permission from APA:







**Product Description** 

(CLV) or equivalent issued in the country of origin of the product or, failing that, in the country where it is marketed, in the case of imported products.

**Free Sale Certificate** 

Quali-quantitative formula of the product Description of the manufacturing method of the product

Information regarding the conservation and stability of the product.

When the trade name under which the product is to be registered is different from the one consigned in the Free Sale Certificate (CLV), the health or competent authority of the issuing country must specify it in the certificate, if feasible. If this is not feasible, the presentation of a sworn statement from the importer will be required, certifying that the product described in the certificate is the same as that which must be registered in Panama under another commercial name.

Digital or scanned copy of the original label or art identical to the original of the food.

Description of the subdivision system.

Any other of a technical and scientific nature that the competent authorities establish to preserve food safety.

The labels must have the complete information required in accordance with current legislation, including the location of the expiration date



The documents identified in numerals 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 10 and 11 may be presented in Spanish or English. All other documentation must be submitted in Spanish. If it is in another language, it must be translated into Spanish by an authorized public translator and must be submitted together with the initial documentation.

All digitized documentation may be verified or verified with its originals, and must be presented in full, which allows verification of its letterheads and stamps, legibly, without crossing out, erasing, or alterations.



Notwithstanding the foregoing, the MIDA, the MICI, and the MINSA may establish registration procedures and simplified requirements for the registration of food from countries to which the Republic of Panama recognizes the equivalence of sanitary and phytosanitary systems. for import.
